#### GREETINGS FROM YOUR COUNCILLOR

## **Dear Varsity View Residents**

Please join me in greeting the fall, always a favourite season for me, especially when it extends as far as possible into the oncoming winter. A highlight of the summer for our family for sure was joining over 200 people in President Murray Park for the awesome SUM Theater performance of the Pied Piper. It was a magical evening that made me feel so grateful to live in Saskatoon. It also revealed this incredible potential of a park to be transformed into a performance center and a gathering of people with just the addition of a rope and theater props. Awesome.

# Planning for more sustainable growth continues

This fall the City will be carrying on with very important planning towards trying to come up with a more sustainable and manageable model of a City at 500,000 people – under the banner of Growing Forward/Shaping Saskatoon. The work underway is to develop plans for a Bus Rapid Transit System 0- along major 8th St, College Drive, 22nd St and Idylwyld. Part of this process is also re-envisioning these corridors to become more 'complete streets' easily accessed by car, walking, and cycling, and with more people living on them to access the Transit system directly. Varsity View is surrounded by these kind of corridor streets, so it is a plan that will have an effect on the borders of the neighbourhood, as discussed quite extensively in the Local Area Planning Process. There will be public open houses to explore these issues further, keep your eve out or sign up to

my newsletter to get more information about where and when they will be held. More information at www.growingfwd.ca

### **Active Transportation**

There will also be an Active Transportation Master Plan process underway to create a coherent and connected plan for cycling and improve pedestrian accessibility throughout the City. This is a long needed plan to move us past one-off projects here and there that are not tied into an overall system. Part of this will also be moving forward with planning and discussion of the Better Bike Lanes idea for downtown, with the goal of implementing a pilot in May of 2015.

#### Infill

While Garden and Garage suite regulations have passed, new rules for infill development are still being finalized and worked out, with a hope of coming to City Council in the next couple of months. This continues to be a big issue in Varsity View I know, and I have talked to many people in the neighbourhood about your concerns, I am working hard to ensure that we achieve a set of guidelines that ensures new infill better fits into neighbourhoods and complements neighbours. This has been a challenging file but we will get there. Stay tuned for more on this.

#### Traffic Calming

Finally, studies and planning is underway now to measure traffic speeds and volumes in Varsity View as part of the Neighbourhood Traffic Calming process underway. Once this information is gathered it will feed into some proposed ideas and strategies for calming traffic in the neighbourhood, to be discussed at an open house in December. Thanks everyone for your patience on this, the process does take time.

Hi everyone,


It's that time of the year again! Fall flag football season is just around the corner and we are contacting you to help get your community involved!
