At a Curbside Swap, unwanted items in good condition are placed on the curb and marked as free, for anyone to pick up. Giving these items a new home keeps them out of our landfill and reduces our community's environmental footprint.

Join the city-wide Curbside Swap day on Saturday, September 12, by placing items on your curb that you want to give away and/or by searching for free treasures that others set-out. Make sure whatever you set-out or pick-up is clearly marked as "FREE." The swap ends by 6:00 p.m., when it's time to return your unclaimed items to your home along with your newfound treasures.

Guidelines

Clearly mark all items that you wish to swap as "FREE" and remove any items you wish to keep from your lawn and curb. Do not block roads/sidewalks with items. Obey all traffic laws and watch for children. Do not drive/walk on other people's lawns. Do not discard items on someone else's lawn/curb.

GREETINGS FROM YOUR COUNCILLOR

Best of the fall season to you,

At City Hall, we are still doing an overhaul of our growth plans with the Growing Forward Shaping Saskatoon process, including plans for a Bus Rapid Transit system and an Active Transportation Master Plan. These plans all have impacts on Varsity View as an area bounded by key transportation corridors that are central to these plans.

There will be meetings coming up in the fall with opportunities for on-line engagement that you can check out at **www.growingforward.ca**. Now is a very good time to make your voice heard. We are also working to invite more citizens into the City Budgeting process earlier, which you can learn more about at **www.saskatoon.ca/city-hall/budget-finances**.

The Federal election campaign is now well underway. It has become very clear to me as a City Councillor that decisions made in Ottawa have a big impact on our ability to build a strong healthy community here. Out of every tax dollar collected in Canada, cities take about 8 cents. We are dependent on strong partnerships with other levels of government to deliver necessary infrastructure, programs and services that provide a good quality of life to all citizens.

As we move ahead with plans for a Bus Rapid Transit plan it will be essential to have support from the Federal government to help pay for new buses, and better shelters and stations, just as we rely on support for bridges and overpasses. Solid commitments to infrastructure spending make a huge difference in our ability to ensure we can keep our roads, bridges, sewer and water lines in good condition.

Other important issues in our city also require a strong partnership with the Federal government to be successful, such as: tackling homelessness and affordable housing, building a path to reconciliation between First Nations, Metis and Non-Indigenous people, creating good jobs in a well-diversified economy, taking meaningful steps towards addressing climate change and building a stronger renewable energy sector, ensuring good policy and programs to support settlement and integration of new immigrants.

These are issues I will be talking to candidates about as the election unfolds, and I hope you will too. Our country continues to have tremendous potential even as we face tremendous challenges. Creating a healthy diverse nation for future generations depends on creating healthy and diverse communities!

Engineering For Kids:

• Junior Mechanical Toys

Our Junior Mechanical Engineering: Toys Unit is designed to introduce our youngest children to the field of mechanical engineering through the investigation and design of an assortment of toys. Your child will learn about various principles of motion as they construct each of the following toys during the course of the unit: Popper, Spinner, Boomerang Can, Wind-Up Whirligig, Buzzer, and the Good Vibrations Guitar.

• Junior Green Engineering

Are you ready to get down and dirty searching for solutions to some of our biggest environmental problems? In Junior Environmental, your child will ponder some truly "hot" environmental issues. Your child will save endangered animals, help plants grow and create protection from the sun's heat. By investigating natural processes like erosion, animal adaptations, and plant growth; we discover ways that we as engineers can be inspired by the world around us to take on all sorts of challenges.

• Aerospace Engineering

Our Aerospace Engineering program is designed to introduce your child to the concepts of aerodynamics, propulsion, structural design, and flight through a series of activities that explore different types of aircraft. Your child will learn the basic mechanics of flying machines through hands-on testing and revising their designs using elements of the Engineering Design Process.

• Environmental Engineering

Our Environmental Engineering program is designed to introduce your child to the concepts of green engineering and provide them with a new approach to the Engineering Design Process that adds constraints such as sustainability, durability, and environmental permanence to the equation.

• Minecraft: Travelling into the Future

This camp will immerse your child in the expansive world of Minecraft, and will challenge your child's ingenuity and problem solving skills as they navigate through several engineering challenges. Your child will learn how to use teamwork and manage resources like an engineer in the real world. Building in Minecraft allows your child to experiment with designs and materials, all without the risks associated with building structures in reality.
