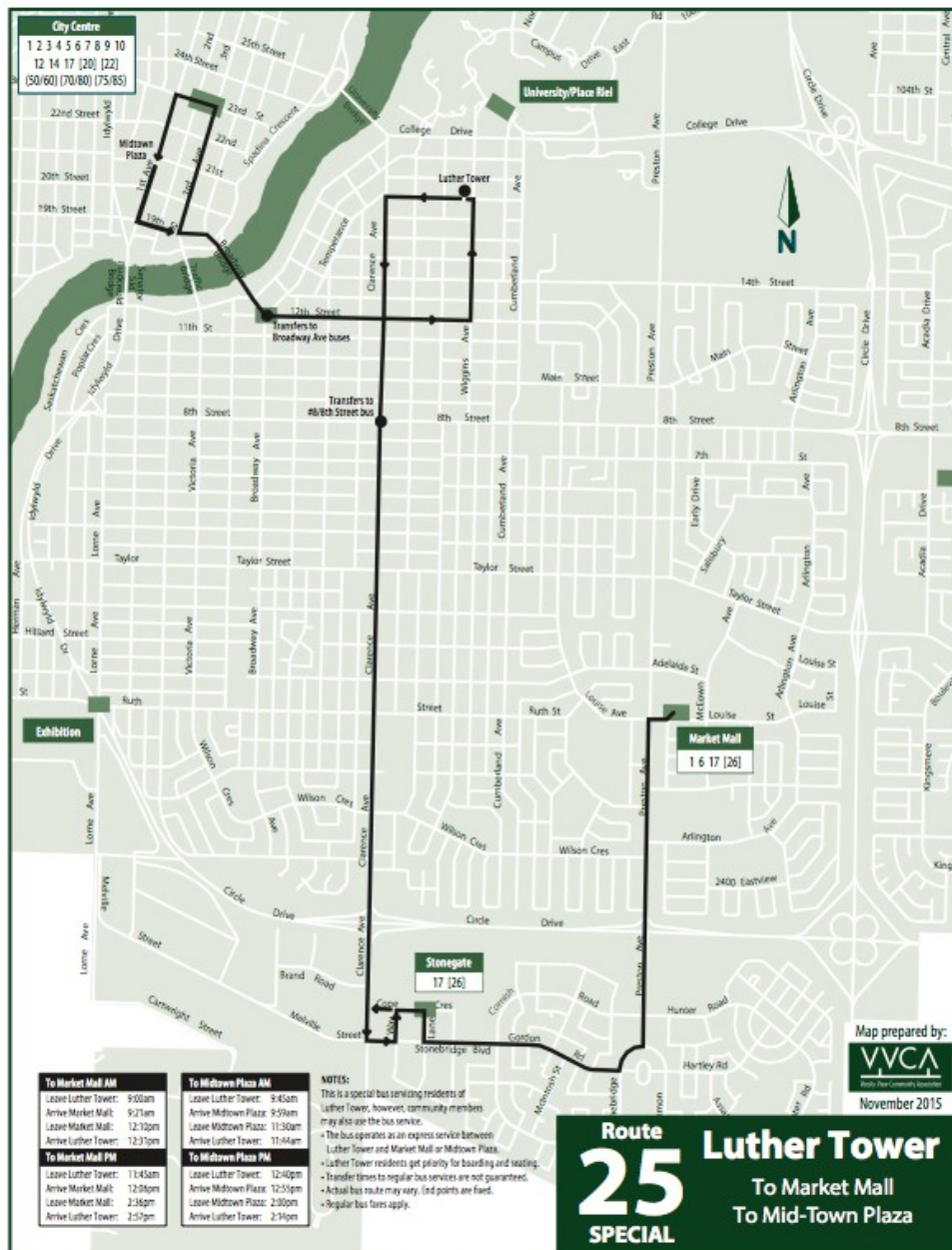

#25 Special Bus Service:

The #25 Special transit service leaves from the sidewalk stop alongside the driveway of Luther Tower, 1223 Temperance Street and serves the residents of Luther Tower, HOWEVER, the bus service is available for community residents to use as well. The bus operates as an express bus between Luther Tower and Midtown Plaza or Market Mall, with a few transfer stops offered. The #25 Special service is available MONDAY to FRIDAY. Regular bus fares apply.

Proviso 1: is that passengers new to this service be kind enough to let Tower residents get into their accustomed seats. They will have been waiting seated in the Tower entrance. They are not required to wait outside for the Temperance St. bus arrival but do go outside for the bus arrival at the Market Mall & Midtown Plaza stops.



Proviso 2: is that in inclement weather & the bus has arrived early, passengers should feel free to get into the seats further back. Darryl Martin, Luther Tower Manager, has offered, in view of the upcoming winter weather, an invite to our VV neighbours who wish to ride the #25 Special bus to come inside our most immediate front door to wait for the bus.
