## REMINDER OF CIVIC ELECTION

2012 Municipal Election Voting Day is Wednesday, October 24

On October 24th, Saskatoon citizens who are eligible to vote will elect a Mayor and City Councillors for the City's ten wards. Elections for Trustees of the Public School Board's ten wards, and seven Trustees for the Catholic School Board will also be held.

If you are unable to vote on Election Day, October 24, you may vote at the advance polls being held at various locations from October 13-20.

Watch for the Saskatoon Voters' Guide which will be delivered to your home with the Sunday Phoenix on October 7. In addition to details on where, when, and how to vote, the Guide includes ward maps and candidate profiles.

Free ride Saskatoon Transit coupons are available for travel to and from the advance and regular polls, and can be found in the Voters' Guide or the City of Saskatoon website.

NEW FOR THE 2012 ELECTION!

+ Elected officials will hold office for four (4) years, as opposed to three (3) years.
+ New ward boundaries have been created - this may change the ward in which you reside, and therefore, the ward in which you will vote.
+ You must prove your identity and address prior to voting.
+ Citizens who will be away from the city during the advance polls and on election day may vote by mail.
